The Sunday of the Unjust Steward – "Faithful Stewardship of Earthly Gifts"

In the Large Catechism under the first commandment, Luther writes, *"the purpose of this commandment is to require true faith and trust of the heart, which settles upon the only true God and clings to Him alone."* In today's Gospel, Jesus pictures through a parable how the faith should not look. Jesus' people should not look like scurrying dishonest stewards, who apply themselves only when all could be lost. Rather, Jesus teaches that just as zealously as the greedy person goes after his money and the worldling after his livelihood, so we should all the more apply ourselves to faith which clings to Christ alone and eternal life in heaven. By God's grace in Christ we have all we need and more for life in this world and the world to come.



Continuing Education ~ August 10 – 14, 2020 (beginning each morning with Matins at 8:30 a.m. each morning and ending with Vespers at 4:00 p.m.) Dr. Peter Scaer ~ Right to Life Issues"

This course will discuss basic issues of children and family. We will consider the work of Margaret Sanger and her campaign against marriage and for birth control. We will then show how Sanger's work turned into legalized abortion via the work of Lawrence Lader and Bernard Nathanson. Next, we will discuss how these issues have affected the Church...including our physical bodies and the Body of Christ. The Council Bluffs Circuit has generously chosen to sponsor this class. 
