**Welcome in Jesus' name** to our guests this holy day. We pray God's richest blessings to you as we hear His Word and receive His gifts. If you're visiting for the first time, please sign our guestbook in the narthex.

**Worship at St. Paul's** is conducted according to the historic, liturgical worship patterns of the Christian Church throughout the ages. The rhythm of worship is from our God to us, and then from us back to Him. He gives His gifts, and together we receive and extol them.

### **St. John, Apostle and Evangelist**

Today is the Feast Day of St. John, Apostle and Evangelist. St. John was a son of Zebedee and brother of James the elder. John was among the first disciples to be called by Jesus (Matthew 4:18-22) and became known as "the disciple whom Jesus loved," as he refers to himself in the Gospel that bears his name. Of the Twelve, John alone did not forsake Jesus in the hours of His suffering and death. With the faithful women, he stood at the cross, where our Lord made him the guardian of His mother. After Pentecost, John spent his ministry in Jerusalem and at Ephesus, where tradition says he was bishop. He wrote the fourth Gospel, the three Epistles that bear his name, and the book of Revelation. Especially memorable in his Gospel is the unique way in which John begins His Gospel, (John 1:1-14) the account of the wedding at Cana (John 2:1-12), the "Gospel in a nutshell" (John 3:16), Jesus' saying about the Good Shepherd (John 10:11-16), the raising of Lazarus from the dead (John 11), and Jesus' encounter with Mary Magdalene on Easter morning (John 20:11-18). According to tradition, John was banished to the island of Patmos (off the coast of Asia Minor) by the Roman emperor Domitian. John lived to a very old age, surviving all the apostles, and died at Ephesus around 100 A.D. We give thanks to God today for the faithful witness of St. John, the Apostle and Evangelist!
