The Cross and Passion of Our Lord Are the Hour of His Glory

"Behold, your King is coming to you . . . humble and mounted on a donkey" (Zech. 9:9–12; Mt. 21:1–9). Our Lord rides in this humble fashion because He is entering Jerusalem to humble Himself even to the point of death on a cross (Phil. 2:5–11). His kingly crown will not be made of gold but of thorns, the sign of sin's curse. For His royal reign is displayed in bearing this curse for His people, saving us from our enemies by sacrificing His own life. The sinless One takes the place of the sinner so that the sinner can be freed. At the name of this exalted Savior, Jesus, we bow in humble faith. With the centurion who declared, *"Truly this was the Son of God!"* (Mt. 27:54), we are also given to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father (Phil. 2:11).



“Honoring God’s House” Campaign Corner

(This week’s entry comes from records shared by Kathy Meldrum. This is a reprint of half of an article from the Council Bluffs Nonpareil, June 15th 1931, detailing the closing of the old church and opening of the new. Next week we will reprint the other half. Thank you Kathy for sharing and enjoy!)

“In one of the most impressive church ceremonies ever held in Council Bluffs, with 3,000-4,000 people present from near and far, dedication of St. Paul’s Lutheran congregation’s new \$90,000 church at the corner of Frank Street and Perrin Ave took place Sunday morning and afternoon.

Those who came to attend the services overflowed the building. Many used the seats in the natural amphitheater to the north of the church and were able to keep in touch with the services through the public address system. Morning services were attended by about 1,200. The largest crowd assembled for the afternoon to hear Dr. Walter A. Maier, the speaker on the Lutheran radio hour. So densely did cars line the streets that officers were detailed to keep traffic moving.

The services began in the morning in the old building, Seventh Street and Seventh Avenue, where the visiting pastors assembled. After the official farewell to the scene of forty years of church struggle, the pastors marched out, followed by the congregation, and marched to the new edifice.

Carry Bible From Old Church

At the door, James C. Larson of C. C. Larson Construction Company gave the key to Henry J. Schneider, supervising architect, who presented it to Henry Meyer Sr., chairman of the building committee, and then to the Rev. Mr. Mueller.

The pastor turned the key in the lock in the “name of the Triune God” and gave the honor of swinging the doors back to admit the congregation to William Reese, 82, the oldest member of the congregation...(read more next week.)
