"Resisting the Unforgiving Flesh"

Walking humbly with our God and forgiving one another

With what shall we come before the Lord (Micah 6:6) who forgives all our sins, and how often shall our fellow Christians sin against us and we forgive them (Matt. 18:21)? Our gracious God on high does not need our "burnt offerings" or "thousands of rams" (Micah 6:6-7), which we could legitimately offer in thanksgiving. He is the Savior who gave His only-begotten Son for our transgression. He offers the fruit of His body, once hanging dead on a cross but now living and giving life in His holy Meal, for the sin of our souls (Micah 6:7). Because He releases us from our enormous debt of sin against Him, we need not imprison our fellow sinners with our lack of love and refusal of forgiveness (Matt. 18:24, 27, 30). As partakers of His grace, we yearn for one another "with the affection of Christ Jesus" (Phil. 1:8). As forgiven sinners, "filled with the fruit of Christ's righteousness," our "love may abound more and more, with knowledge and discernment" (Phil. 1:11, 9), for He leads us "to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with [our] God" (Micah 6:8).

Happy 140th Birthday St. Paul's!


Coming up very soon is the 140th Birthday of our congregation! Rev. William Mallon, as we have stated earlier this year, helped establish our congregation formally on November 27th, 1881. But this wasn't the first-year work was done in Council Bluffs by the Missouri Synod, earlier known as the "Synod of Missouri, Ohio and Other States." In a recent Newsletter we find this quote from former Pastor Lindemeyer who served from 1910-1915:

“As I look back in retrospect over the days from 1865 to 1915 I am struck with the reflection: 16 years of exploring and missionary endeavor before a church could be organized, 1865-1881; Intermittent indeed, but work. “A stony field” one is apt to think...God’s work may be hard at certain times and places, but it is never in vain. In the end it prospers. So here. He has definitely promised results, if we but labor and wait upon Him, but not without struggle or patience. So we should never be discouraged when we are not successful in the opinion of some individuals, or some become back-sliders, but be encouraged by His gracious promises and keep on sowing the seed of the word till in God’s own time a harvest is reaped.”
