Kantor’s Notes: In our Gospel reading, Jesus not only shows His power of a man’s paralysis, but He also speaks words of absolution, bestowing forgiveness of sins. Today Jesus continues to bestow His forgiveness through Word and Sacrament, granting wholeness in both body and soul. Today, we pray that God would by His “bountiful goodness keep from us all things that may hurt us” (collect), especially our sinful flesh, that we might cheerfully serve Him. Therefore, we claim God’s holy Name “against the demon snares of sin, The vice that gives temptation force, The natural lusts that war within” (LSB 604:4). We seek to put off the old self in repentance, that we might receive Christ’s absolution (LSB 614). We gladly declare “Now my conscience is at peace...Christ hath purchased my release And my ev’ry sin remitted” (LSB 609:6) even as we put on the new self and live in peace with one another (Ephesians 4:22-28).
