Kantor's Notes: In accordance with the day's theme of Christ's final return, "Lo! He Comes with Clouds Descending" is the suggested Hymn of the Day for Advent 2. Just as Jesus ascended and "a cloud took him out of their sight" (Acts 1:9), so Jesus will come again amidst clouds of glory. Charles Wesley's hymn draws on the language of Revelation 1:7, "Behold, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of him. Even so. Amen." On the Day of Christ's coming, His identity will be clear to all, causing terror to all who have rejected Him. On the other hand, to those who have believed in His Name, that Day will be a glorious Day, as they gaze upon the One whose scars declare His cross and victory. Therefore, with alleluias, we worship Him now and forever as our ever-reigning King.
