**Kantor's Notes:** In Isaiah 60:1, the prophet writes, "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you." That light was ultimately made known in the Epiphany of our Lord, as those from distant lands came to worship Him. In accordance with the Biblical texts, references abound in hymnody to Christ as the Light of the nations. Drawing on the language from Revelation 22:16, "O Morning Star, How Fair and Bright," nicknamed the queen of chorales, hails Christ as the Morning Star who comes with truth and light. Likewise, the hymn "Arise and Shine in Splendor" is based on the theme of light as it reflects on the Isaiah 60 text. Finally, our new hymn of the season, "O Word of God Incarnate," refers to Christ as the "Light of our dark sky." Can you find more examples of Christ as Light in today's hymnody?
