Kantor's Notes: Today's gradual is LSB 942, "Kyrie! God, Father." The words *Kyrie eleison* are examples of words from another language (like *Amen* or *Alleluia*) that the church retains in its usage, thus maintaining a continuity with ages past. In the case of *Kyrie eleison*, the words have Greek origin and were passed along into Latin. The word *Kyrie* means "Lord," and the word *eleison* means "have mercy." As such, it reflects the Biblical cry for mercy in such texts as Matthew 9:27; 17:15; 20:30-31; Mark 10:47-48; Luke 17:13; 18:38-39, as well as in today's Gospel text. The cry confesses that we come as beggars before God who rely not on ourselves but upon Him alone in faith. The threefold repetition present in many settings of the *Kyrie* alludes to the Holy Trinity, a fact that is made explicitly clear in this setting as it names each Person of the Trinity.
