Kantor Notes: As Holy Week draws near, our attention is drawn to the opposition Jesus faced by unbelievers, culminating in His death on Good Friday. Jesus endured this opposition and death for us in order that He might be the once-for-all sacrifice for all sinners. The writer to the Hebrews proclaims of Jesus' sacrifice, "How much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to serve the living God." Today, we remember that the blood of Christ purifies us from sin, setting us

at peace. LSB 431 and LSB 433 especially speak of this blood of Christ. LSB 572, while it might be a newer hymn to our congregation, beautifully traces the theme of sacrifice throughout the Bible. Take some time before the service today to read through these hymns!




