

Kantor's Notes: The title for the Second Sunday of Easter, *Quasimodo Geniti*, is taken from the opening words of the Introit, "Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk [of the Word.]" (2 Peter 2:2a). Our Gospel reading tells us the reason. In that reading, we learn of Thomas, who at first doubted Jesus' Resurrection, but upon seeing Jesus, believed. John reminds us that this account and all of the words of his Gospel are written so that we too might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing, we may have life in His Name. Hence, we long for the Word of God (as the Introit reminds us) because it strengthens us in faith in Jesus.

Today, we pray for this strengthening of faith in the lives of our confirmands, just as we sing in this year's confirmation hymn: "O may you here through all your life Continue through all joy and strife, In life devoted to your Lord, Each hour rejoicing in His Word. And on that final glorious Day You with Christ's saints will gladly say, 'You are my Lord and God and King, To You forever, I will sing!"

Ezekiel 37:1–14

And I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." ⁴Then he said to me, "Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. ⁵Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. ⁶And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD."

⁷So I prophesied as I was commanded. ¹⁹On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²²And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld."

²⁴Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord."
