Kantor Notes: We Christians can sing boldly on the basis of the confidence that we have in Christ. Because Christ is risen from the dead as our victorious and gracious Lord, we can "sing the glory of [God's] name" (Introit) "in songs of great jubilation" (LSB 483). The title of today's service, *Jubilate*, highlights this jubilation and praise. Notice how we sing, "This/Jesus shall be my confidence" at the end of each stanza of our Hymn of the Day (LSB 490). Listen for how this confident reality is highlighted in today's servion theme!



How can water do such great things? Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three:

"He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying." (**Titus 3:5-8**)
