### “One generation commends its works to another...” Psalm 145:4

The verse above was the theme for our recent Iowa District West Convention. It was a fitting theme as President Steve Turner retired at this event, and a new President was elected, Rev. Paul Egger from Galva, Iowa. While there were many reflections happening over this recent three day period, it also gave me an opportunity to reflect on the generation just past. For on June 19th, I was pastor here at St. Paul's for 20 years myself!

20 years is considered one generation. A generation is basically the general time it takes for a baby to be born, grow up and then become a parent. That means that right now, there could be adults getting married at St. Paul's who I baptized as infants! And, it appears that this is beginning to happen!

As I reflect over the past 20 years I am especially drawn to the people of our church and the time we've spent together. While there were certainly some events or times that stick out in my mind as more impressive than others, my attention seems to just be going to the reality of daily life together as Christians.

For example, when I was first a pastor, I might walk into a hospital room to see you, or have a private visit with you and it would feel a little formal. Like, “Hello, nice to see you. I'm so sorry to hear that. Let us pray to the Lord etc. etc.” Now when I see you, we have likely already been through a lot together. In fact, after 20 years, you tend to, not only know people, but quite possibly, you've endured some great joys and tragedies together. Now when

I walk into the hospital room to see you or visit at your home or over the phone its more like, “Hey, what's goin' on?” “What are you doing here again?” or “What did your wife do to you this time!” (Ha, ha!) I feel like now we share a very comfortable “familial” relation. We are indeed family in Christ.

In other news, did you know that 20 years equals 1,040 Sunday Sermons? I don't know how many times I've preached over the last 20 years but I'm thinking you've endured a lot of minutes listening to me. For that, I am sorry!!! While I like to kid and joke about my long sermons and your sleep

patterns in the midst of them, I really do take the preaching task seriously. And truly, I'm not ever thinking about how long a sermon is as much as I'm trying to clearly present God's Word so that you can hear and learn and grow in understanding and knowledge. Truly, I believe this is one of my most important jobs as one of your pastors, which I take very seriously.

Speaking of sermons, I never, ever, ever would have believed 20 years ago

that some of my most cherished times with you would occur at funerals. Before I became a pastor I never thought about funerals very much. I'd go to one if I had to. However, I have come to believe that these are some of the most challenging moments of ministry for me and some of the most rewarding. Most challenging because I love you. Most rewarding...because I love you. If the most important job I have is sharing God's Word, then sharing God's Word at the death of a Christian might be one of the most important things a pastor could do. What does one say to a group of people mourning the loss of a loved one? Do we have hope in this moment? Is there really something that can be said to offer comfort? Yes, yes, yes! Being able to share the certain hope of God's forgiveness in Jesus our Savior, especially at the time when it hurts the most, is a great honor and blessing to me personally.

I don't know what the Lord has in store for us over the course of the next 20 years, but I do know that our job is to “commend our work to the next generation.” As I sit and write this at the Nebraska District Convention exhibiting for David's Harp, I realize that I am telling people that “our job is to raise up the next generation of Church musicians.” But that's not all. Our job is to give away and pass along all that we have received from the LORD. His love, His word, His grace and His forgiveness. Our legacy is not found in the things of this life, but the gifts of God for the life to come.

Thank you for your support over the last 20 years. May God be with us in the days to come. +Pr. Sherrill

## Preserving the Church's Song Organ Project Update

The Bedient Organ Company team was back at St. Paul's during the week of May 26th to install the framework in the Chancel and Transept openings that will hold the new working Pedal Octave 8 and Prestant 8 pipes. The Bedient team also installed the windchests, and air reservoirs for the remaining pipes that will be installed in the Great Chamber Room, immediately behind the Chancel and Transept openings. Bedient is now back in Lincoln, NE working in their shop on the final pipes. During the week of June 9 - 14, The Bedient team returned to work on wiring the windchests to the master control panel in the Choir Room. Bedient also installed the Zimbelstern in the Great Chamber Room. If you look through the Transept opening you can see the Zimbelstern hanging on the wall. The Zimbelstern went into use on Sunday, June 15th. Bedient will be back after June 19th, to install the final 500 pipes for the organ. During July the Bedient staff will be back making the final tuning and voice settings for the organ. Pastor Frank will be on hand during the final tunings and adjustments. As the ranks are signed off and ready, Pastor Frank will begin to pull the remaining blue tape off the stops on the organ console and begin to use those during Worship Services. So if you listen carefully now and again in July you will notice those new pipes, ranks, stops being put to use. Pastor will, as space allows, will put notations in the Kantor notes when the new sections are going to be used. Pastor Frank is also making arrangements for some very special guest organist to be here for a dedication ceremony, subject to their availability. Once Pastor has everything set, we will announce the date for the full dedication service. Below and on the following page are pictures from the installation work done to date.

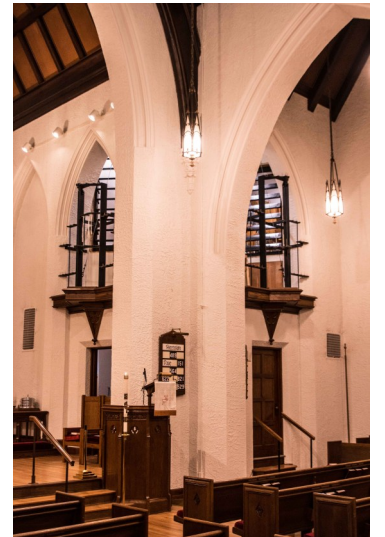
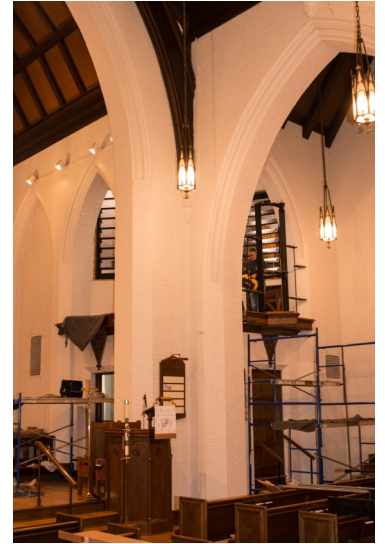

*“When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.”  
 (Acts 2:1–4)*



The day of Pentecost in Acts 2 was an amazing day! The people heard a sound like a mighty rushing wind. They saw tongues as of fire resting over the disciples. They listened to the message of Jesus being preached to them in their own native languages. About 3,000 people believed and were baptized. We read of this amazing day long ago and perhaps wonder, “How is the Holy Spirit working among us today?”

Look at the image below. What is the father doing? What does the crucifix on the wall suggest about whom are they reading? How do you think this image is connected to Pentecost and to our hymn?

In stanza 1 of our hymn, we pray that the Holy Spirit would pour out His grace on each believer, uniting the Church to sing God’s praise. The fact that you are singing and playing this and other Christian hymns is due to the work of the Holy Spirit! In stanza 2, we pray that the Holy Spirit might work through the Word of God so that we might know God rightly. As fathers teach their children about Jesus through the Holy Bible (as pictured), and as mothers and teachers and pastors do the same, the Holy Spirit works so that we can joyfully call upon God as our heavenly Father. The fact that you learn of Jesus from the Bible and pray is due to the work of the Holy Spirit! Finally, in stanza 3 we pray that the Holy Spirit might comfort us and keep us true to God and that we may boldly and willingly serve Him. Do you suppose the children in our image will do chores or homework after their devotion? This willingness to serve God within our vocations is also due to the work of the Holy Spirit!

Does your family have family devotions? Perhaps you could read together the account of Pentecost in Acts 2! As you do so, sing this hymn and know that the Holy Spirit is working among us today through the Word of God, just as He was working on that first Pentecost!

## 2025 Iowa District West Convention Recap



On June 8th through June 10th, 2025, the 42nd annual Iowa District West Convention was held at Camp Okoboji. The theme for the IDW Convention was Psalm 145:4 “One generation commends Your works to another”.

St. Paul’s member Bill Kruse was our member delegate, along with Pastor Frank, and Pastor Sherrill, attended the convention.

Delegates elected new a President, and 1st and 2nd Vice Presidents. Rev. Paul Egger was elected President, Rev. Jonathan Riggert and Rev. Benjamin Dose as first and second vice-presidents. Current IDW President Rev. Steven Turner announced last year he was retiring and would settle in Des Moines, IA.

The items on the agenda that affect St. Paul’s the most were, Rev. Nathan Sherrill was elected as Circuit “Visitor” for the Council Bluffs Circuit of IDW (let this be a lesson to everyone, make sure you attend church sponsored meetings. If you don’t you get drafted. Pastor Sherrill originally accepted being the Circuit Visitor last year, but it became official at the convention. If you would like to know what a Circuit Visitor is, please go back and read the August 2024 edition of The Word that explains what the Circuit Visitor does.

The other item that will affect St. Paul’s and the Council Bluffs Circuit is five of the former Southwest Circuit of Iowa District West were merged into the Council Bluffs Circuit. The new Congregations in the CB Circuit are: Clarinda, Immanuel, Clarinda, St. John, Clarinda, St. Paul, Shenandoah, Trinity, and Villisca, Mt. Calvary. The other six Congregations of the Southwest Circuit were merged into the Adair Circuit, and Des Moines East Circuit of IDW. The main reason for this realignment was the Southwest Circuit size had dropped below the 1,500 minimum. LCMS Constitutional ByLaw 3.1.2(a) An electoral circuit shall consist either of one or two adjacent visitation circuits, as shall be determined by the district board of directors on the basis of the following requirements: each pair of delegates shall represent from 7 to 20 member congregations, involving an aggregate confirmed membership ranging from 1,500 to 10,000”;

## St. Boniface's Bliztorte

We Lutherans like to celebrate our church's history and the German Heritage that comes with it. Today's recipe is named for St. Boniface, an English Benedictine Monk whose heart and work was to bring the gospel to the Franks (Germanic tribes). He lived from about 675 to 754, nearly eight hundred years before Martin Luther, and was instrumental organizing the Christian Church in the Germanic parts of Francia. He and his party was martyred on the way to a meeting to confirm new believers, when a band of armed robbers attacked, believing the chests they carried held gold and silver. The attackers found only sacred texts. Legend says that St. Boniface held up a copy of the Gospel to fend off his attacker, who stabbed him through the book. Many statues show him holding a Bible with a sword piercing it. We give thanks to God for all those who have worked and suffered (past and present) to spread the good news of Jesus to a world in desperate need of it.



### Ingredients

- ½ C shortening
- 1 C sugar divided in half
- 4 egg yolks (unbeaten)
- 2½ tsp vanilla or almond extract divided
- 1 C all-purpose flour sifted
- 2 tsp baking powder
- ¼ tsp salt
- ½ C milk
- 1 C cold heavy whipping cream
- 2 tbsp powdered sugar
- ¼-½ C slivered almonds optional
- ½ C chopped berries optional

### Instructions

1. Preheat the oven to 350. Separate the eggs into two separate bowls with whites in one and yolks in another.
2. Cream the shortening, sugar, egg yolks, and 1 tsp. of the vanilla/almond extract together. Beat until well blended.
3. Add the sifted flour, baking powder, and salt to the mixture. After incorporated, add the milk. Beat well.
4. Put the cake batter in 2 greased 8" cake pans.
5. Beat the remaining egg whites until peaks form. Add the other ½ cup sugar and another 1 tsp. vanilla/almond extract to the eggs. Beat until it is an airy and light whipped meringue. Spread it evenly between the two battered pans and sprinkle with almonds.
6. Bake for about 35 minutes until the meringue is set. Cool the pans fully on a wire rack.
7. Make the whipped cream filling by beating cold cream, powdered sugar, and remaining ½ teaspoon of extract together.
8. Place one cake on the serving plate with meringue side up. Spread whipped cream between layers. Add more slivered almonds or berries if you'd like. Place the other cake on top with the meringue side up, too. Keep refrigerated until serving and using a serrated knife to cut!
