Dear Friends in Christ,

Over the last year I have had a lot of fun with the Thursday women's Bible Study Class thinking about the seasons of our lives, like, when we were kids, and what our personal and family traditions were. We decided that, after we discussed Thanksgiving and Christmas and Easter and springtime and fall and summer and winter traditions, many of our memories surround our senses. We asked ourselves, "Do we remember certain things more fondly when you add one or more of our senses?" As we approach Thanksgiving this year, I was thinking a lot about our bible study conversations from last year! And I'm thinking, "Yes, absolutely, we remember better in connection to our senses." The fresh baked bread, grandma's famous potatoes and stuffing, grandpa raising and butchering the turkey, cousins coming over, the crisp autumn air, the fresh baked pumpkin pie, the hot applesauce and on and on! Can you smell it all with me!!?

It is true, we have so many wonderful memories surrounding the senses and seasons of our lives. In our bible study then we moved on from those practical memories in order to add the component of our faith. While our family traditions are so special and the smells and "feels" of our times are often memorable, what makes it all so extra special is that these days are more than just "holidays," they are

opportunities for us to center our hearts on God's goodness and love, a truth powerfully expressed in Psalm 118:1: "Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his love endures

forever". While we can list our blessings, often in connection to our traditions around the season,—our families, health, and daily bread—the psalm calls us to a deeper, more foundational gratitude, one that begins with thanking God for His very character and attitude toward us, not

just His earthly gifts.

Martin Luther called Psalm 118 "my own beloved psalm." He said, "I would trade all the wealth and power of the Pope and Emperor for it." One reason for this is seen in verse 6 where the psalmist states, "The Lord is on my side, I shall not fear, what can man do to me?" And verses 17 where we read, "I shall not die but I shall live and declare the works of the Lord." I think Luther loved this psalm so much because it moves past the temporal gifts of this life to the eternal gifts that God also gives, even the certain hope of eternal life in Christ. Luther thought he turned the world upside down. He was often depressed and despondent. But God's word was his anchor throughout his life. He would often turn to hymns and psalms and biblical texts for reassurance, comfort and hope. This same hope in Christ is what elevates our joy throughout the seasons of our lives as well.

With Luther, we can rejoice in this Psalm as we celebrate the seasons. By it we are reminded that every good thing we have is a gift from Christ, who is the center and fulfillment of all our hope and joy. Thanksgiving, as an example, is not just a reflection on the good times or good things; but it is also a time wherein we can reflect positively in times of distress. Just as the psalmist cries out to God in trouble so also we can cry out to God.

Just as God delivered the psalmist, or was with him in trouble, so God delivers and is with us too.

This sense came out in our conversations of Thanksgiving in our bible study, for many of the women in our class have lived through times that have been difficult and even dangerous. It has been so rewarding to be in these discussions and hear how God's people are able to be humble and constant in faith and love, even during times of trouble, distress, want and need.

This Thanksgiving, we can take comfort in knowing that God's love is not a fickle or conditional thing. His "lovingkindness is everlasting". His love is on display in Christ's sacrifice, where our sins are forgiven. Even when we are ungrateful or blind to the blessings He showers on us daily, God remains faithful.

This year let us join together in thanksgiving, not just for the good things we see, and taste and smell, but for the God who is good. Let us give thanks for the gift of our churches, and the community of faith that provides mutual consolation and support. Let us use this Thanksgiving to rejoice in God's enduring love, which provides a sure foundation for our lives, even amidst the challenges of the world.

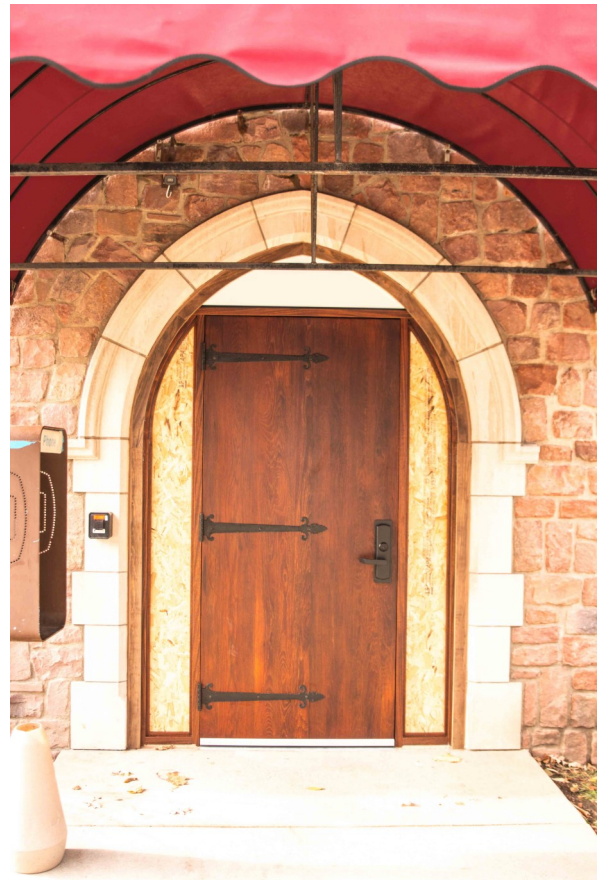
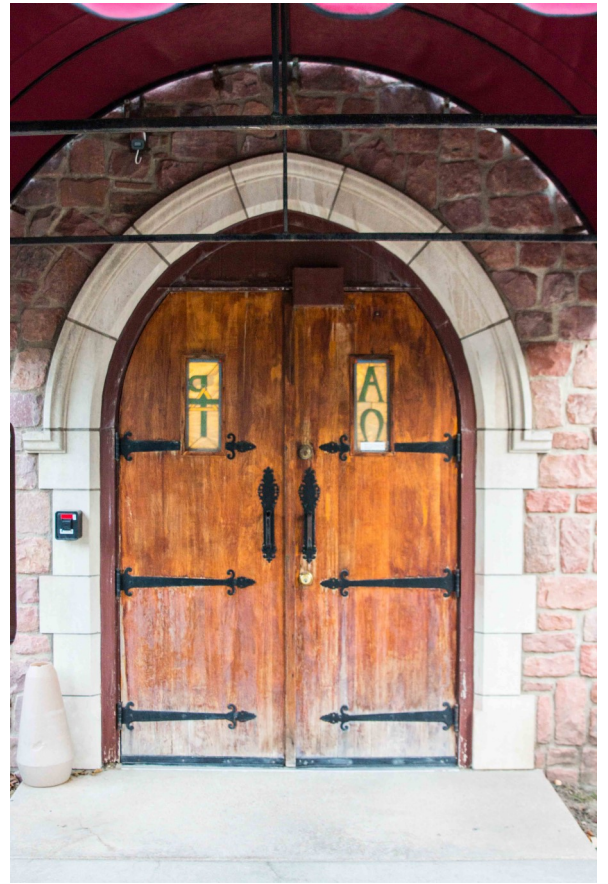

St. Paul's Lutheran Church Installs New Perrin Ave Accessible Door

After nearly 56 years, and one complete rebuild in the late 1980's - 1990's, the double entrance doors on the Perrin Ave. entrance to St. Paul's Education Wing were replaced between Monday, October 20, 2025, and Wednesday, October 29, 2025. A new single accessible compliant door was installed. A new keypad will allow the door to open automatically for those members and visitors who need door to open automatically. New hardware was installed in the Church Office and Media Center to allow the door to be opened automatically from those locations. The side glass panels on either side of the new door will include the existing stained glass panes from the old double doors. These are being built now and should be installed by early December.

A few items of note on the new door: The framing, and door itself are made of solid cherry wood. The door itself was made locally in Omaha by a cabinet maker. Set Apart to Serve Summit and Lilly Foundation National Conference

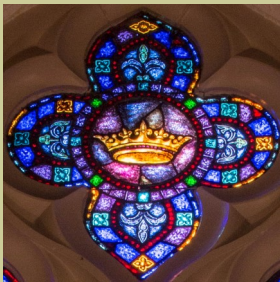

November Recipe of the Month

With the change of weather to distinctly fall chilliness, this month's recipe is an old English comfort food recipe. We use it this month to remember the Reformation and those whose faith in Jesus alone led them to stand firm even to martyrdom.

St. Robert Barnes was an English Augustinian Priest turned Lutheran who worked to help bring the Reformation to England. He preached a "Lutheran" leaning sermon at Christmas Day Midnight Mass in 1525 at a time when King Henry VIII was trying to stop the smuggling of Martin Luther's books into England. He was disciplined and imprisoned. Upon release and subsequent house arrest, he continued distributing Tyn-dale's illegal English Bible. He escaped England in 1528 and made his way to Wittenburg where he stayed with Martin and Katie Luther.

While there he published a work titled "A Supplication to Henry VIII" which found favor with King Henry's advisor Thomas Cromwell. He was invited back to England in 1531 and worked for the next nine years trying to convince the King to adopt Lutheranism. Though hopeful at first, by 1538, the king rejected Lutheranism, disillusioned by its stern refusal to let him divorce and remarry. In 1540, Robert Barnes was convicted of heresy and burned at the stake with two other Lutheran pastors.



St. Robert Barnes Toad-in-the-Hole

Prep Time: 10minutes mins

Cook Time: 30minutes mins

Servings: 4 people

Ingredients:

- 3 large eggs
- 1 ¼ C all-purpose flour
- ¼ C water
- ¾ C milk
- 1 tbsp mayonnaise
- ¼ tsp salt
- ¼ tsp pepper
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 lb high-quality sausage-

Instructions

1. Preheat the oven to 425 F. To make your batter, whisk eggs, water, and flour together in a big bowl until lump free. Slowly add milk, mayonnaise, salt, and pepper and whisk until well combined. Place in the fridge until required. (at least 30 minutes)
2. Stir together the oil and sausages in a metal or ceramic (preferably not glass) casserole dish in a uniform pattern. Place the dish in the oven and cook for 10 minutes.
3. After 10 minutes, remove the dish from the oven, take the batter out of the fridge, and quickly pour it around the sausages, returning the dish to the oven. Bake for another 25-30 minutes. Do not open the oven until at least 25 of those minutes have passed to reduce the batter deflating. Done when toothpick comes out clean. Serve immediately when crisp and warm!

Note: Keeping the oven temperature consistently very hot is key to this recipe being light and not doughy. So resist the urge to open the oven door to check on doneness until the very end. Often served with onion gravy.
