

Kantor's Notes: In Isaiah 60:3, the prophet writes, "And nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising." Today's sermon will explore what this prophesy means in consideration of what we know about kings and kingship. Our hymn of the season, "The Star Proclaims the King Is Here," reflects on kings and kingship in connection to King Herod: "The star proclaims the King is here; But, Herod, why this senseless fear? For He who offers heav'nly birth Seeks not the kingdoms of this earth." (LSB 399:1). Thanks be to God that our Lord Jesus has come to rule not as an earthly king but as our heavenly King. "To Him shall prayer unceasing And daily vows ascend; His kingdom still increasing, A kingdom without end." (LSB 398:4)
