Kantor Notes: Today, we remember God's rich mercy given to us in Christ which we in turn are blessed to show to others within lives of Christian discipleship. Our Hymn of Invocation (LSB 791 – "All People Who on Earth Do Dwell") reminds us of God's mercy in Stanza 4: "The Lord our God is good: His mercy is forever sure." Likewise, Distribution Hymn LSB 852 contains the theme of mercy in the title and

throughout the hymn: “O God of Mercy, God of Might.” The appointed Hymn of the Day LSB 696 “O God, My Faithful God” is a fitting prayer for our Christian lives as we seek God as the source of all perfect gifts. Finally, we remember that Christian discipleship is “preserved and perfected by the Spirit”; thus, we will sing several hymns imploring the Holy Spirit’s sanctifying grace.
