The image above is a tender reminder of God's care for His people. Because the children in the image are safe and secure in the hands of God, they can open their hymnal and sing joyful praises to Him!

The hymn "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty" reminds you that you too can joyfully sing because you are safe and secure in God's care. It is He who has given you salvation through the life, death, and resurrection of His Son. It is He who gives you health and the ability to sing and praise. It is He who continues to sustain you, providing those things that are needful for your life.

This hymn reminds us of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed, in which we confess "God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth." Martin Luther, in his Small Catechism, explains this article beautifully, describing how God gives us everything we have and still takes care of us. Can you share with your parent or teacher some of God's blessings for which you are thankful?

If you have a Small Catechism, compare your list to Luther's list. You might even consider memorizing Luther's explanation while working on this hymn!

Luther's explanation ends with the words, "This is most certainly true." Another way to say this is with the Hebrew word amen, likewise meaning, "This is most certainly true." Can you find the amen in the final stanza of this hymn? How do you think you should play or sing this hymn?

Knowing that God's Word is true, that God is faithful to us through His Son, and that He cares for us daily, you too can add a loud Amen to the praises of God's people. Your adoration and praise is but a prelude to the eternal adoration and praise that you will sing around God's throne. Therefore, open your hymnal, like the children in the image, and "Gladly forever adore Him" (st. 5)!



In the past six months there has been a rather large make over down at The St. Paul's Center. Since St. Paul's Voters gave approval at the annual meeting in February, policies, procedures, cleanup, restructuring, tours, programs, camps, classes, new websites, social media pages, cold calls, more tours, have occurred. If you blinked, you missed half a year already. As you are reading this article, a new high school - college Bible study, led by Isaiah Lusajo, is now half-way through its 15 week course. The 2026 Camp Creation I & II camps completed in early June. The 2026 Summer Program is approaching the halfway mark, along with a new Summer Tutoring Program is going strong. Finally the second of five High Horse Collective: Art for All Summer Camps have complete. A weekly "Senior" Art Class will be starting on Tuesday, July 7, and every Tuesday thru July 21st. The St. Paul's Center Gardens is growing, growing, growing, and growing. The pumpkin vines are sprouting pumpkin blooms so there will be plenty of pumpkins for Oktober-Fun-Fest in September.

Our long time anchor at The St. Paul's Center, The Early Childhood Center has reached the goal of 50 students enrolled at the ECC over the summer months. Several more children will be starting in August and September. Miss Becca, Miss Glenda, and Pastor Sherrill are giving tours of the ECC almost on a daily basis. The ECC students are enjoying the splash pool water activities on Wednesdays, therapy dogs have come to visit and even got to pet cows and sheep during the week Camp Creation.



Speaking of cows and sheep, the Camp Creation II theme this year was Stewardship. Students learned to sew, building a log cabin, milk cows, shear sheep, gardening, cooking from scratch. Activities at The Center do not stop when summer is over, Oktober-Fun-Fest will be on Saturday, September 26th from 3pm to 7pm. This is going to be our big celebration showcasing The Center and all the programs housed there. This fall we will be adding additional programs Academic Tutoring, Parents Night Out Evening Recovery Program, Council Bluffs Connections. Future programs include Lutheran Church Charities Comfort Dog visiting the ECC on a bi-monthly basis.

# Seeing The Word of The Lord Capital Campaign Update 1

Over the course of the next several months with help from Miss. Lois Hanusa, her brother Tim Hanusa, and research from the St. Paul's Heritage Archives, we are going to take a tour of each of the thirty-four stained-glass windows here at St. Paul's. At the same time an existing page on the St. Paul's website will be updated in the background containing the same historical information on each window. Before we begin the tour, here is the history we have located regarding the stained-glass windows.

## **History of the Stained-Glass Windows 1929 - Present**

In 1929 the St. Paul's building committee signed a contract with the St. Joe's Stained-Glass Window Company to manufacture the stained-glass windows based on descriptions for each window. The designs for the windows were drawn up and sent to a factory in Czechoslovakia to manufacture each window. The windows were created and shipped to Council Bluffs between 1930 and 1932. The factory in Czechoslovakia was destroyed in World War II. Over the years the St. Joe's Stained-Glass Company closed its doors (the exact closure date is unknown). The stained-glass windows were paid for by different members, groups, and friends of St. Paul's. One example is the Sunday School students used their offering money to pay-off the Altar window. In addition to their weekly offerings, the students collect foil gum wrappers from chewing gum to turn in as scrap metal for collection.

In the summer of 1972, Lexan window coverings were installed on the exterior of each stained-glass window.

In the early 1990's former St. Paul's member Jim Howard completed re-leading and repair of all eight aisle stained-glass windows. The work to repair the windows was paid for by a generous donation by Bill & Kathleen Kruse. Jim traced each window and notated where each piece of glass was on each window before taking apart each window. This was a tedious process that took two to three months to complete each window.

In 1993-1994 St. Paul's Voters approved a major capital improvement campaign that included the replacement of the Lexan window covering on the Christ window above the entrance of the church. The project also included the purchase and installation of two stained-glass windows for the new accessible elevator lift. The theme of the two stained-glass windows came from the gospel of St. Luke 5:17-25 "Jesus Healing of the Paralytic".

In 2021 St. Paul's Voters approved another major capital campaign project. The stretch goal of the project was included if funds were raised to replace the exterior window coverings of the stained-glass windows.

On Sunday, April 12, 2026, St. Paul's Voter's approved a bid by the Willet Stained-Glass Company of \$396,545.00 to repair the stained-glass windows. To date, St. Paul's Members have raised \$125,384.00 in donations, with pledge amounts totaling \$ 15,000.00.

In the upcoming editions of The Word, we will begin the explanation of each of the 34 stained-glass windows.

# Nicholas Heights Hospitality House

Several years ago, Dr. C established Nicholas Heights for friends and visitors of St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Dr. C enjoyed when guests would come and stay for a few days. Nicholas Heights provided guests with a place to stay, relax, and enjoy the hospitality of Dr. C.

Pastor and Susan Tews continued this tradition during their stay at Nicholas Heights. After Pastor Tews death in 2025, St. Paul's Church Council and Board of Elders decided to discontinue having someone stay at Nicholas Heights full-time and to turn it into a full-time Hospitality House for the entire St. Paul's Congregation to utilize.

Nicholas Heights Hospitality House works like a B&B, you call the St. Paul's Church Office and ask if the Hospitality House is available for dates you need. Depending on availability, number of guests, and rooms we may assign you the basement or the upstairs. If there is someone already staying upstairs, we may put you in the basement.

All we ask is when your guests are done staying at the Hospitality House to please cleanup, and put your sheets and towels in the washing machine. Our Hospitality Team will step in afterwards, and prepare Nicholas Heights for the next incoming guests.
