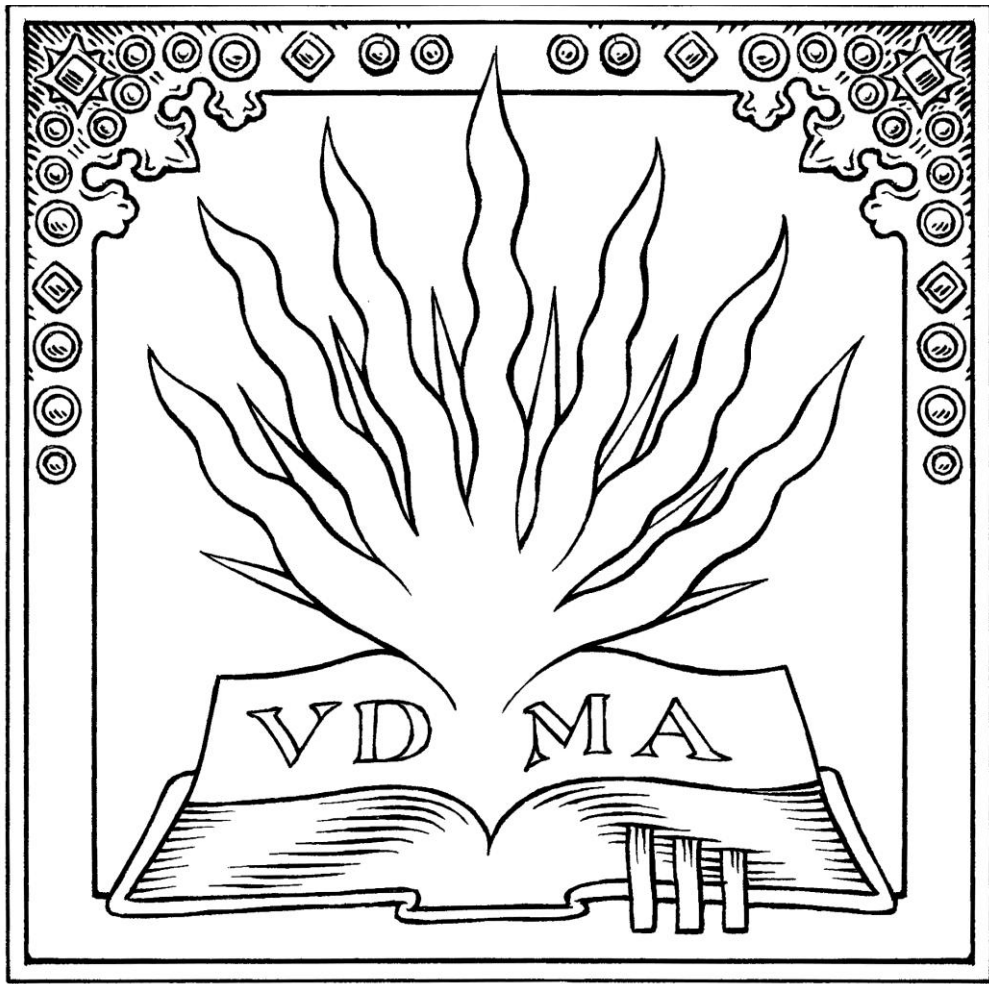

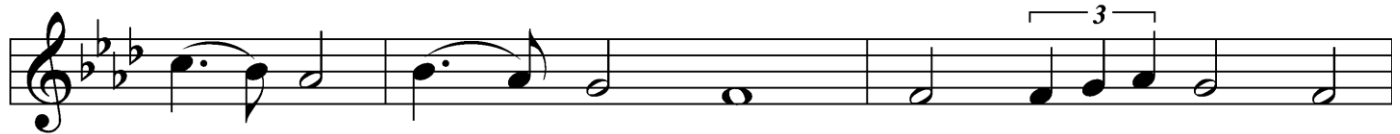

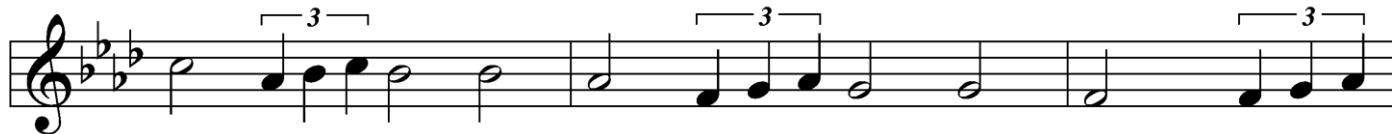

Choir season resumes in September! Pastor Frank is finalizing the choir schedules for the upcoming year. More information will follow in the next few weeks.

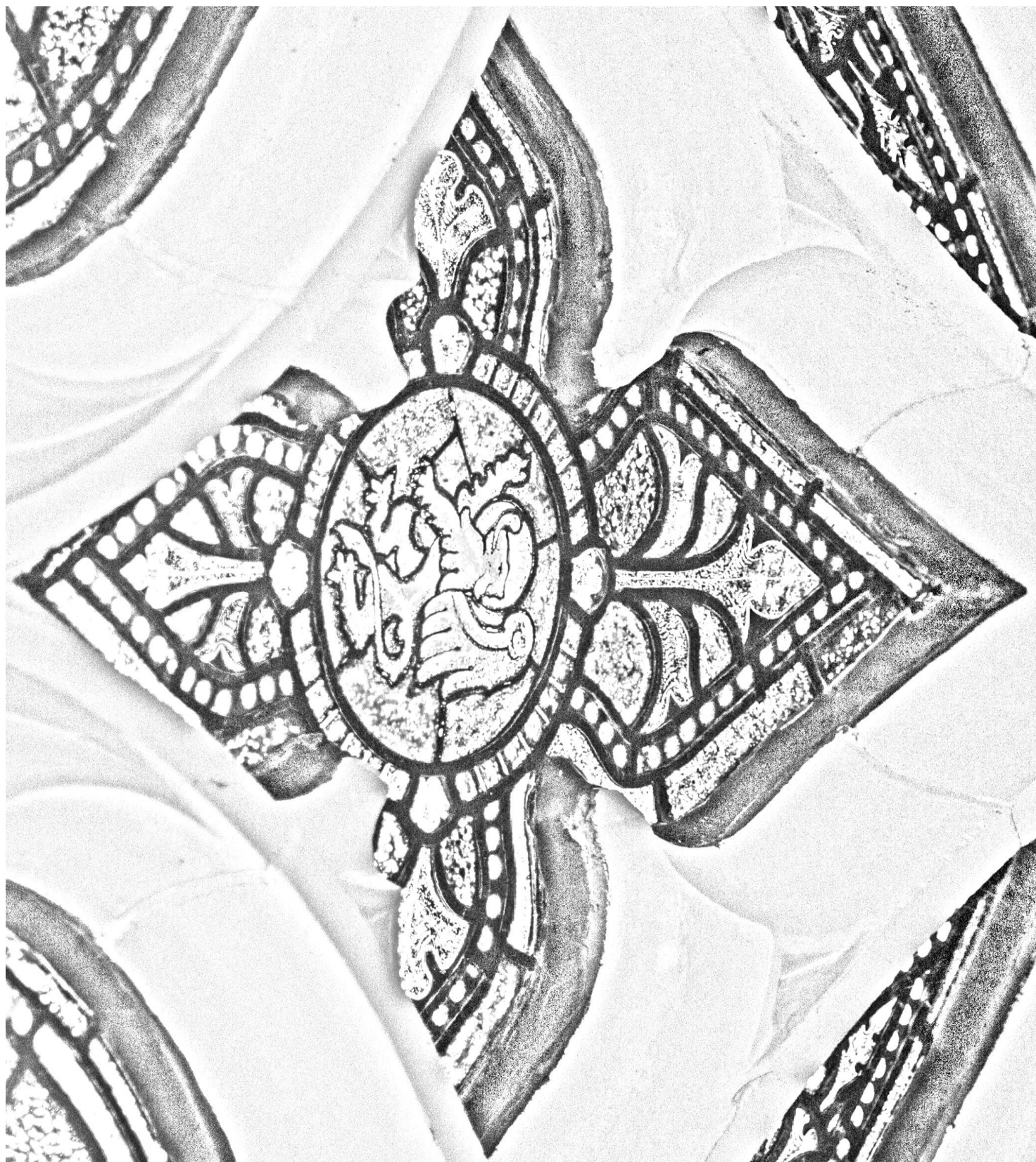
